COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION

of 18.3.2024

on the financing of the annual action plan in favour of the Republic of Rwanda for 2024

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THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union, amending Regulations (EU) No 1296/2013, (EU) No 1301/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1304/2013, (EU) No 1309/2013, (EU) No 1316/2013, (EU) No 223/2014, (EU) No 283/2014, and Decision No 541/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012¹, and in particular Article 110 thereof,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2021/947 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 9 June 2021 establishing the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe, amending and repealing Decision No 466/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU) 2017/1601 and Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 480/2009², and in particular Article 23(2) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) In order to ensure the implementation of the annual action plan in favour of the Republic of Rwanda for 2024, it is necessary to adopt an annual financing decision, which constitutes the annual work programme, for 2024. Article 110 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 ('the Financial Regulation') establishes detailed rules on financing decisions.
- (2) The envisaged assistance is to comply with the conditions and procedures set out by the restrictive measures adopted pursuant to Article 215 TFEU³.
- (3) The actions provided for in this Decision should contribute to climate mainstreaming in line with Commission Communication 'The European Green Deal'⁴ and in the Inter-institutional Agreement of 16 December 2020 between the European Parliament, the Council of the European Union and the European Commission on budgetary discipline, on cooperation in budgetary matters and on sound financial management, as well as on new own resources, including a roadmap towards the introduction of new own resources⁵.
- (4) The Commission has adopted the National Multiannual Indicative Programme (MIP) for the period 2021-2027⁶ which sets out the following priorities: i) Education, Skills

and Decent Jobs for the Youth, ii) A Green Deal for Inclusive Development; and iii) Political and Economic Governance.

- (5) The objectives pursued by the annual action plan to be financed under the Regulation (EU) 2021/947, geographic programme ‘Sub-Saharan Africa’, are to (i) support access to and quality of early childhood development and education in Rwanda; (ii) support sustainable urbanisation in Rwanda; and (iii) consolidate accountability, reconciliation and access to justice as foundational blocks for a peaceful cohesive society.
- (6) The action entitled ‘Agricultural transformation through skills upgrading of women and youth in Rwanda’ will seek to increase sustainability, climate resilience and inclusivity of agriculture practices by strengthening skills of women and youth including persons with disability in Rwanda. It will be part of the Team Europe initiative on ‘Investing in Sustainable and Inclusive Agricultural Transformation’.
- (7) The action entitled ‘Inclusive, smart and climate-proof urban development of Rwandan satellite cities’ will contribute to ensure an inclusive, competitive and climate change resilient development in the cities of Nyamata and Rwamagana in Rwanda. It will be part of the Team Europe initiative on ‘Sustainable Rwandan Cities fit for the digital age’.
- (8) The action entitled ‘Kigali Urban Mobility Programme’ seeks to improve the safe, accessible and climate resilient mobility of women, men, girls and boys in their diversity and goods within Kigali and with the rest of Rwanda and neighboring countries. It will be part of the Team Europe initiative on ‘Sustainable Rwandan Cities fit for the digital age’. The action will also seek to improve access to the Mombasa-Kisangani corridor through the Gatuna (Rwanda) / Katuna (Uganda) border, thus contributing to the EU-Africa: Global Gateway Investment Package on Strategic Corridors
- (9) Pursuant to Article 26(1) of Regulation (EU) 2021/947 indirect management is to be used for the implementation of the action.
- (10) The Commission is to ensure a level of protection of the financial interests of the Union with regards to entities and persons entrusted with the implementation of Union funds by indirect management as provided for in Article 154(3) of the Financial Regulation.
- (11) To this end, such entities and persons are to be subject to an assessment of their systems and procedures in accordance with Article 154(4) of the Financial Regulation⁷ and, if necessary, to appropriate supervisory measures in accordance with Article 154(5) thereof before a contribution agreement can be signed.
- (12) It is necessary to allow for the payment of interest due for late payment on the basis of Article 116(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (13) In order to allow for flexibility in the implementation of the action plan, it is appropriate to determine the changes which should not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (14) The action plan provided for in this Decision is in accordance with the opinion of the Committee established under Article 45 of Regulation (EU) 2021/947,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1
The action plan

The annual financing decision, constituting the annual action plan for the implementation of the annual action plan in favour of the Republic of Rwanda for 2024, as set out in the Annexes, is adopted.

The action plan shall include the following actions:

- (a) ‘Agricultural transformation through skills upgrading of women and youth in Rwanda’ set out in Annex 1;
- (b) ‘Inclusive, smart and climate-proof urban development of Rwandan satellite cities’ set out in Annex 2;
- (c) ‘Kigali Urban Mobility Programme’ set out in Annex 3.

Article 2
Union contribution

The maximum Union contribution for the implementation of the action plan for 2024 is set at EUR 36 000 000, and shall be financed from the appropriations entered in budget line 14.020121 of the general budget of the Union.

The appropriations provided for in the first paragraph may also cover interest due for late payment.

Article 3
Methods of implementation and entrusted entities or persons

The implementation of the actions carried out by way of indirect management, as set out in the Annexes, may be entrusted to the entities or persons referred to or selected in accordance with the criteria laid down in point 4.4.1 of Annexes 1, 2 and 3.

Article 4
Flexibility clause

Increases or decreases of up to EUR 10 000 000 and not exceeding 20% of the maximum Union contribution set in the first paragraph of Article 2, or cumulated changes⁸ to the allocations of specific actions not exceeding 20% of that contribution, as well as extensions of the implementation period shall not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial Regulation, where these changes do not significantly affect the nature and objectives of the actions.

The authorising officer responsible may apply the changes referred to in the first paragraph. Those changes shall be applied in accordance with the principles of sound financial management and proportionality.
