The Americas and the Caribbean

In view of the new political and policy context, several multiannual indicative programmes for the Americas and the Caribbean need to be amended.

Since the adoption of the country and regional multiannual indicative programmes (MIPs) for the Americas and the Caribbean in 2021, the EU has achieved tangible progress in its engagement with Latin America and the Caribbean. In June 2023, the High Representative and the Commission adopted the Joint Communication 'A New Agenda for Relations between the EU and Latin America and the Caribbean', making the case for a stronger and modernised partnership through reinforced political engagement, boosting trade and investment, and building more sustainable and inter-connected societies.

The EU-CELAC Summit held in Brussels on 17-18 July 2023 was a historic encounter eight years after the last one. The Summit conveyed a message of commitment to defending a peaceful rules-based international order and to renewing and modernising the bi-regional partnership. It paved the way for a reinforced dialogue on inclusive green and digital transitions while also consolidating our dialogue on social issues, governance and security. Furthermore, the EU-Caribbean Leaders' meeting on 17 July 2023 confirmed the strengthened institutional engagement between the EU and the Caribbean. To complete the policy cycle, the Council approved Conclusions on relations between the European Union and Latin America and the Caribbean in November 2023.

The Joint Declaration adopted at the July Summit acknowledged the potential contribution of the EU-LAC Global Gateway Investment Agenda (GGIA) to address investment gaps in line with the common priorities of the EU and Latin America and the Caribbean. The agenda includes about 130 illustrative initiatives at the country and regional levels aiming at accelerating the fair green and digital transitions. The EU-LAC GGIA encompasses various areas including renewable energy and renewable hydrogen, critical raw materials, decarbonisation, electromobility, transport infrastructure, 5G and last-kilometre connectivity, digitalisation for public services, sustainable forest and water management, agricultural production, health products manufacturing, sustainable finance, the issuance of green bonds and an increased cooperation on education and skills.

Importantly, the cooperation in the fight against transnational organised crime and against illicit goods and human beings trafficking has become a pressing priority for both the EU and the countries in the region, given the unprecedented threat posed by criminal groups and growing security risks, threatening also democratic stability. These risks have also negative consequences on the business environment and investments and should be addressed to enable GGIA implementation. Hence, peace and security should remain a priority area in Latin America and the Caribbean for 2025-2027.

Finally, the transatlantic partnerships with the United States and Canada remain key foreign policy relationships for the EU and its Member States, especially in the current geostrategic context and in the response to Russia's military aggression against Ukraine.

The outcomes of the mid-term review of NDICI-Global Europe programming for the region take into account the above policy developments, security situation and Summit commitments, particularly concerning the operationalisation of the GGIA at the country and regional levels for the Latin America and the Caribbean region. It entails the creation of a dedicated "Support to investments" envelope in the regional MIP.

to the multiannual indicative programme for the Americas and the Caribbean for the period 2021-2027

Acknowledging that the EU's relationship with the region has evolved significantly since the EU-CELAC Summit (Brussels, 17-18 July 2023) and the new policy framework in place, changes will be made as follows to update the basis for programming, integrate the regional health initiative, and integrate the needs of the EU-LAC Global Gateway Investment Agenda, particularly in terms of support to investments.

In order to support investments and ensure a stronger alignment with the Global Gateway strategy in the region, a dedicated "Support to investments" envelope is established, pooling investment-related funds (provisioning of EFSD+ guarantees, corresponding technical assistance, the top up from NDICI-Global Europe cushion for the European Investment Bank (EIB)investment window 1, EIB external lending mandate legacy and support to EU-LAC Global Gateway Investment Agenda operations such as blending). This envelope will serve EU and partner countries' shared interests across different Global Gateway priorities and support partnerships in strategic areas. It aims to leverage and scale up private and public sector investment as well as further mobilise the financial institutions. It will provide the required flexibility to support Global Gateway projects according to their opportunity and maturity at country and regional level.

The multiannual indicative programme for the Americas and the Caribbean for the period 2021-2027 is hereby amended as follows:

i. The 4th paragraph of section 1.1 "Basis for programming" is replaced by the following paragraph:

"While remaining consistent with global policy aims, the regional MIP will focus on moving forward the EU's specific policy objectives and strategic interests vis-à-vis the Americas and the Caribbean, and on building partnerships on areas of shared interests with regional groups and countries throughout Americas and the Caribbean. It will support the outcomes of the third EU-CELAC Summit held on 17-18 July 2023 and its regional roadmap for 2023-25, as well as the Council Conclusions adopted for the relations with the region in the Council meeting held on 21 November 2023. In that sense the regional MIP will support the EU's Global Gateway strategy and its EU-LAC Global Gateway Investment Agenda for the region.

The regional MIP will also support the implementation of the Samoa Agreement, which was signed in November 2023 between the EU and its Member States and the Members of the Organisation of African, Caribbean and Pacific states (OACPS). The Agreement contains dedicated regional protocols, including a specific Caribbean Regional Protocol, which provides a legally binding framework for cooperation between the EU and the Caribbean countries of the OACPS."

ii. The text of the first bullet point in the 8th paragraph of section 1.1 "Basis for programming" is replaced by the following text:

"Regional strategies: 2023 Joint Communication "New Agenda for Relations between the EU and Latin America and the Caribbean"; the joint declaration and the regional roadmap following the third EU-CELAC Summit held on 17-18 July 2023; the Council Conclusions on EU relations with Latin America and the Caribbean, adopted on 21 November 2023;"

iii. The 2nd paragraph of section 1.2 "Priority areas" is replaced by the following paragraph:

"The regional MIP will include two regional windows: one Pan-American, covering all countries in Americas and the Caribbean, and one specifically for the Caribbean, given the specific nature of the EU's relationship with this sub-region, in particular since the signature of the Samoa Agreement in

November 2023. A dedicated "Support to investments" envelope is established to support the implementation of the Global Gateway strategy and other investments in the region. The NDICI-Global Europe creates the possibility of LAC-wide regional and sub-regional initiatives to engage with all countries regardless of their level of income."

iv. Before the sub-section on "cross cutting issues" of section 1.2 "Priority areas" a sub-section "Support to investments" is created and the following text is added:

Support to investments - This envelope will host the part of the regional MIP dedicated to support investments including the provisioning of EFSD+ guarantees, the corresponding technical assistance, the top up from NDICI-Global Europe Cushion for the European Investment Bank (EIB) on investment window 1, the external lending mandate legacy as well as support to EU-LAC Global Gateway Investment Agenda operations such as blending."

v. The 4th paragraph of section 2.1.5 is completed by the following text:

"On health, the regional MIP will support the implementation of the EU-LAC partnership launched in June 2022 on "manufacturing vaccines, medicines and health technologies, and strengthening health systems".

vi. The 4th bullet point of the sub-section A "Regional Cooperation Facility" of section 3.2 "Support measures: Cooperation facility, strategic communication and public diplomacy, policy dialogue and support to the external dimension of EU policies" is replaced by the following text:

"Facilitation of TEIs and Global Gateway Investment agenda (GGIA) initiatives at regional and multicountry level and for countries without a MIP."

- vii. The title of the Section 4 is replaced by the title "Support to investments".
- viii. The following text is added to the Section 4:

"The "Support to investments" envelope will serve EU and partner countries' shared interests across different Global Gateway priorities and support partnerships in strategic areas. It aims to leverage and scale up private sector investment and further mobilise the financial institutions and will provide the required flexibility to support Global Gateway projects according to their opportunity and maturity at country and regional level."

The multiannual indicative programme for the Republic of Guyana, for the period 2021-2027 is hereby amended as follows:

i. The following text is added to the section 1.3 "Priority area of the EU cooperation with Guyana":

Priority area: Health System Resilience and Pharmaceuticals Manufacturing

This partnership operationalises the initiatives included in the Global Gateway investment agenda for Guyana, aiming to support the development of local medicines and vaccine manufacturing. It also contributes to the commitments made by Guyana, Barbados and Rwanda in 2022, during the launch of the Pharmaceutical Equity for Global Public Health initiative and backed by the EU. This initiative aims to ensure an equitable access to medicines and vaccines through partnerships with the private sector and creating opportunities for investment between Africa and the Latin America and the Caribbean region.

Interventions under this partnership will build on EU's support to the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) to ensure an equitable access to health technologies and strengthening local manufacturing capacities in the LAC region, as well as on EU's support to creating an enabling environment for private sector investments that can build the resilience and self-sufficiency of national health systems in Guyana and in the region. Water and sanitation are an intrinsic part of the Global Gateway and will also be the focus of our support under this partnership.

ii. The following text is added to the section 1.4 "context and justification":

Having been the world's fastest growing economy in 2022, Guyana has the ambition to become a new regional centerpiece. While the nation boasts a wealth of natural resources, its health sector is investing to fully meet the needs of its diverse population and with the aim of becoming a bio-medical hub for the Caribbean region, including manufacturing of health products and vaccines. However, Guyana's health sector faces challenges amidst its pursuit of equitable and accessible healthcare for all its citizens (health access coverage still below the high expectations of Guyana authorities with a Universal Health Coverage index of 76/100), namely on regulatory frameworks, availability and adequacy of health workforce and research and development in pharmaceuticals and biotechnology.

In addition, Guyana aspires to develop pharmaceutical production through multilateral and triangular cooperation in coordination with Barbados and Rwanda, as well as other countries in the region, such as Cuba and Mexico. It provides a clear opportunity for the EU and Team Europe to jointly advance the partnership for health resilience and pharmaceutical manufacturing in LAC.

- iii. Section 2.2 "Proposals of country/multi-country regional TEIs" is renumbered to section 2.3 "Proposals of country/multi-country regional TEIs".
- iv. Section 2.3 "Subregional and multi-country dimension" is renumbered to section 2.4 "Subregional and multi-country dimension".
- v. Section 2.4 "Support to investment under the EFSD+" is renumbered to section 2.5 "Support to investment under the EFSD+".

- vi. A new section 2.2 "Priority area 2: Health system resilience and pharmaceutical manufacturing" is created.
- vii. The following text is added to the new section 2.2 "Priority area 2: Health system resilience and pharmaceutical manufacturing":

The overall objective of the EU-Guyana partnership on health system resilience and pharmaceutical manufacturing, will be to strengthen health systems and promote access to health, including water and sanitation.

The main risk is that while the development of the health sector is key for the diversification of the economy, the policy dialogue under this priority area should engage on efforts towards universal health coverage for everybody, leaving no one behind and strengthening of primary health.

Human rights protection and promotion, gender mainstreaming, participation of civil society and inclusion of vulnerable groups, including Indigenous People, in the health sector will form part of the policy dialogue under this partnership. The partnership will contribute to the objective of the EU Gender Action Plan III (GAPIII)¹ on strengthening economic and social rights and empowering girls and women. This includes economic empowerment, promoting gender equality in education and promoting universal access to health. The Country Level Implementation Plan (CLIP) 2021-2025 for Guyana may be updated to include the health sector.

- Specific objectives related to the priority area and expected results per specific objective SO1: Strengthen health system resilience, access to health, and health business environment:
 - a) Health service delivery is improved through: (i) digitalisation of health facilities, particularly at primary level; (ii) ensuring adequate water and sanitation in all health facilities; (iii) continued support to organ transplant program.
 - b) Business environment is conducive in the health sector.

SO2: Support and reinforce opportunities for skills transfer with all EU-based Pharma value chain stakeholders:

- a. Effective collaboration in training of health workforce, in line with national Human Resources for Health national strategy and, promoting schemes of public-private partnerships, particularly for medical staff, clinical staff and hospital administrative and management staff,
- b. Applied research and product development fostered, in collaboration with EU firms and institutions;
