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COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION

of 12.12.2022

**on the financing of the multiannual action plan in favour of the Republic of South Sudan
for 2022 and 2023 part 1**

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THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU),

Having regard to Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union, amending Regulations (EU) No 1296/2013, (EU) No 1301/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1304/2013, (EU) No 1309/2013, (EU) No 1316/2013, (EU) No 223/2014, (EU) No 283/2014, and Decision No 541/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012¹, and in particular Article 110 thereof,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2021/947 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 9 June 2021 establishing the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe, amending and repealing Decision No 466/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU) 2017/1601 and Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 480/2009², and in particular Article 23(2) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) In order to ensure the implementation of multiannual action plan in favour of the Republic of South Sudan for 2022 and 2023 part 1, it is necessary to adopt an multiannual financing decision, which constitutes the annual work programme, for 2022 and 2023. Article 110 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 ('the Financial Regulation') establishes detailed rules on financing decisions.
- (2) The envisaged assistance is to comply with the conditions and procedures set out by the restrictive measures adopted pursuant to Article 215 TFEU³.
- (3) The Commission has adopted the National Multiannual Indicative Programme⁴ for the period 2021-2027, which sets out the following priorities: Governance and Peacebuilding, Inclusive and Green Economic Growth, and Resilience Building and Social Inclusion.
- (4) The objectives pursued by the multiannual action plan to be financed under the Regulation (EU) 2021/947 geographic programme 'Sub-Saharan Africa' are to promote sustainable development and stability in the Republic of South Sudan.
- (5) The action entitled 'Strengthening local governance and resilience in South Sudan' aims to contribute to local community peace and resilience in South Sudan.

- (6) The action entitled ‘Support on an Enabling Environment for Elections in South Sudan’ aims to promote a peaceful and enabling environment for inclusive and transparent democratic processes to take place.
- (7) The action entitled ‘Cooperation Facility 2022-2023’ aims to contribute to the strategic visibility of the EU in South Sudan, to ensure a sufficient level of monitoring of EU supported projects and technical assistance in the development of new projects for EU to support.
- (8) Pursuant to Article 26(1) of Regulation (EU) 2021/947 indirect management is to be used for the implementation of the action.
- (9) The Commission is to ensure a level of protection of the financial interests of the Union with regards to entities and persons entrusted with the implementation of Union funds by indirect management as provided for in Article 154(3) of the Financial Regulation.
- (10) To this end, such entities and persons are to be subject to an assessment of their systems and procedures in accordance with Article 154(4) of the Financial Regulation⁵ and, if necessary, to appropriate supervisory measures in accordance with Article 154(5) thereof before a contribution agreement can be signed.
- (11) It is necessary to allow for the payment of interest due for late payment on the basis of Article 116(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (12) In order to allow for flexibility in the implementation of the action plan, it is appropriate to allow changes which should not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (13) The action plan provided for in this Decision is in accordance with the opinion of the Committee established under Article 45 of Regulation (EU) 2021/947.

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1
The action plan

The multiannual financing decision, constituting the multiannual action plan for the implementation of the multiannual action plan in favour of the Republic of South Sudan for 2022 and 2023 part 1, as set out in the Annexes, is adopted.

The action plan shall include the following actions:

- (a) Strengthening local governance and resilience in South Sudan set out in Annex 1;
- (b) Support on an Enabling Environment for Elections in South Sudan set out in Annex 2;
- (c) Cooperation Facility 2022-2023 set out in Annex 3.

Article 2
Union contribution

The maximum Union contribution for the implementation of the multiannual action plan for 2022 and 2023 is set at EUR 26 000 000, and shall be financed from the appropriations entered in the following lines of the general budget of the Union:

- (a) budget line BGUE-B2022-14.020121-C1-INTPA: EUR 9 000 000;
- (b) budget line BGUE-B2023-14.020121-C1-INTPA: EUR 17 000 000 for exercise N+1.

The appropriations provided for in the first paragraph may also cover interest due for late payment.

The implementation of this Decision is subject to the availability of the appropriations as provided for in the draft general budget of the Union for 2023 following the adoption of that budget by the budget authority or as provided for in the system of provisional twelfths.

Article 3
Methods of implementation and entrusted entities or persons

The actions will be implemented by way of indirect management with pillar-assessed entities (Annex 1 and Annex 2), and through direct management through grants (Annex 2) and procurement (Annex 1 and Annex 3).

The implementation of the actions carried out by way of indirect management, as set out in the Annexes, may be entrusted to the entities or persons referred to or selected in accordance with the criteria laid down in point 4.4.1 and 4.4.2 of the Annex 1 and 4.4.3, and 4.4.4 of the Annex 2.

Article 4
Flexibility clause

Increases or decreases of up to EUR 10 000 000 not exceeding 20% of the contribution set in the first paragraph of Article 2, or cumulated changes to the allocations of specific actions not exceeding 20% of that contribution, as well as extensions of the implementation period shall not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial Regulation (provided that these changes do not significantly affect the nature and objectives of the actions).

The authorising officer responsible may apply the changes referred to in the first paragraph. Those changes shall be applied in accordance with the principles of sound financial management and proportionality.
