COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION

of 16.12.2021

**on the financing of the Annual Action Plan 2021 in favour of the Republic of South
Africa**

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THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (TFEU),

Having regard to Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union, amending Regulations (EU) No 1296/2013, (EU) No 1301/2013, (EU) No 1303/2013, (EU) No 1304/2013, (EU) No 1309/2013, (EU) No 1316/2013, (EU) No 223/2014, (EU) No 283/2014, and Decision No 541/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012¹, and in particular Article 110 thereof,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2021/947 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 9 June 2021 establishing the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe, amending and repealing Decision No 466/2014/EU and repealing Regulation (EU) 2017/1601 and Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 480/2009², and in particular Article 23(2) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) In order to ensure the implementation of the Annual Action Plan 2021 in favour of the Republic of South Africa, it is necessary to adopt a annual financing decision, which constitutes the annual work programme, for 2021. Article 110 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2018/1046 ('the Financial Regulation') establishes detailed rules on financing decisions.
- (2) The envisaged assistance is to comply with the conditions and procedures set out by the restrictive measures adopted pursuant to Article 215 TFEU³.
- (3) The actions provided for in this Decision contribute to climate mainstreaming in line with the European Green Deal and the inter-institutional agreement.
- (4) The Commission has adopted the National Multiannual Indicative Programme⁴ for the period 2021-2027, which sets out the following priorities: sustainable, resilient, transformative and inclusive growth; reducing inequalities; and partnerships.
- (5) The objectives pursued by the Annual Action Plan 2021 to be financed under the Regulation(EU) 2021/947 geographic programme 'Sub-Saharan Africa' are to assist the Government of South Africa in promoting sustainable, resilient, transformative growth; reducing inequalities and promoting partnerships.

- (6) The action entitled ‘NDICI Technical Cooperation Facility (NDICI TCF)’ aims to support the identification, formulation, implementation, audit and evaluation of actions; to ensure that cross-cutting issues are adequately addressed; and to improve capacity for EU-South Africa partnership.
- (7) The action entitled ‘Civil Society – Capacity Enhancement, Dialogue and Recovery (CEDAR)’ aims at strengthening an active citizenship and at promoting a more sustainable and inclusive development.
- (8) It is necessary to allow for the payment of interest due for late payment on the basis of Article 116(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (9) In order to allow for flexibility in the implementation of the action plan, it is appropriate to allow changes which should not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial Regulation.
- (10) The action plan provided for in this Decision is in accordance with the opinion of the Neighbourhood, Development and International Cooperation Instrument – Global Europe Committee established under Article 45 of Regulation (EU) 2021/947.

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1
The action plan

The annual financing decision, constituting the annual action plan for the implementation of the Annual Action Plan 2021 in favour of the Republic of South Africa, as set out in the Annexes, is adopted.

The action plan shall include the following actions:

- (a) NDICI Technical Cooperation Facility (NDICI TCF) set out in Annex 1;
- (b) Civil Society – Capacity Enhancement, Dialogue and Recovery (CEDAR) set out in Annex 2.

Article 2
Union contribution

The maximum Union contribution for the implementation of the action plan for 2021 is set at EUR 12 000 000 and shall be financed from the appropriations entered in the following budget line 14.020122: EUR 12 000 000 of the general budget of the Union.

The appropriations provided for in the first paragraph may also cover interest due for late payment.

Article 3
Flexibility clause

Increases or decreases of up to EUR 10 000 000 and not exceeding 20 % of the contribution set in the first paragraph of Article 2, or cumulated changes⁵ to the allocations of specific actions not exceeding 20 % of that contribution, as well as extensions of the implementation period shall not be considered substantial for the purposes of Article 110(5) of the Financial

Regulation provided that these changes do not significantly affect the nature and objectives of the actions.

The authorising officer responsible may apply the changes referred to in the first paragraph. Those changes shall be applied in accordance with the principles of sound financial management and proportionality.
