

# EU-Guinea-Bissau: country projects

## TRANSPORT

Rehabilitating 115 km of the N2 road between Bissau and the Mpack border crossing with Senegal to facilitate population's access to economic activities and markets and enhance trade and regional integration.

## HEALTH

Supporting rural health centres in providing quality care to women and children in order to reduce mortality rates. Five regional hospitals and 7 health centres have benefit from works to improve water and electricity supply with solar energy.

## GOVERNANCE

- Strengthening the security and justice sectors to ensure better rule of law, quality service delivery and respect for human rights
- Supporting Government's reforms on public finance management and promoting increased transparency and oversight of the Parliament and of the civil society

## EDUCATION

Supporting the improvement of youth and women's employability through education and technical and vocational training. Up to now, 780 young people were trained and 1 020 joined the job market.

## CITIES

- Supporting national authorities on urban planning and to improve living conditions in urban areas with a focus on water, waste and sanitation
- Rehabilitation and construction of waste collection and treatment centres and landfill sites

## AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES

Supporting agribusiness and fisheries value chains (cashew, rice, mango, and artisanal fishing) to promote economic and inclusive growth and create decent jobs. Results so far: rehabilitation of 200 km of rural roads, construction of 78 hydraulic works for erosion protection, reforestation of 24 770 m<sup>2</sup> of mangrove and rehabilitation of 14 264 ha of mangrove rice.

These outputs do not capture the whole of the Team Europe engagement in country. They capture concrete infrastructure investments under Global Gateway. They will be accompanied by soft measures in a 360° approach, so as to improve the policy, regulatory and business environment, develop skills, foster innovation and transfer technology.
